

What to do if you are exempt and cannot wear a face covering?

Information about exemption cards



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This is Easy Read information about what to do if you are **exempt** because you cannot wear a face covering.



Exempt means:

- a person does not have to do something that others have to do
- that a person has reasons why they cannot wear a face covering.

Who is exempt from wearing a face covering?



1. **Children under the age of 12 years old** are exempt from wearing a face covering.



2. People who **find it hard** to wear a face covering are exempt from wearing a face covering.



This could be:

- disabled people
- people with physical health conditions like asthma.

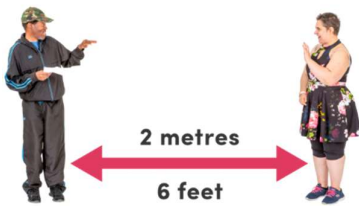


3. Deaf or hearing impaired people can ask people to lower their masks while talking.

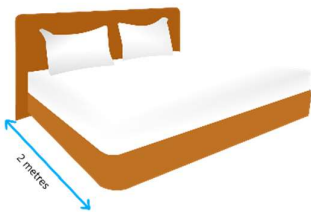


This is so Deaf and hearing impaired people can:

- lip read what is being said
- see how faces move as part of understanding what is being said.



If people do not know each other they must stay **2 metres** apart from each other.



2 metres is about as long as a bed.

I am exempt from wearing a face covering: cards and mobile screen savers



If you cannot wear a face covering you may:

- be worried about people asking you why you are not wearing a face covering
- not be able to tell people why you cannot wear a face covering.



An **exemption card** has been made for you to show people if you are asked why you are not wearing a face covering.

An **exemption card** lets people know that you are unable to wear a face covering.



The exemption card can be:

- printed to carry in your wallet or bag



- downloaded and used as a screen saver



- printed as a large size poster to carry in your bag.



It is your choice whether you want to use the exemption card.
